SCSU Budget

The SCSU is currently working on updating the budget with updated figures from all operations; as well as hoping to begin the process to receive our audited statements soon. We are looking for ways to collectively ensure that the budget expresses our political motivations; while also being fiscally responsible.

SCSU Restaurants Incorporated (SRI) Update

Our franchises have performed as expected and predicted over the month of May and June. Strategies are being put in place, to ensure that the franchises do not run at a loss, yet that student jobs remain in place – no individuals are being let go. In fact, we will begin positions for KFC soon.

Rex's Den is in its final stage of renovation: the patio and speaker system are all that remain. An action plan has been put into place to begin work on the patio by next week. Other than that, Rex's menu – at least for the summer – will be redesigned. We are playing around with various design and marketing elements.

Rex's Den Tasting/Alcohol Safety Event

During the Rex's Den weekly operations meeting, the notion of a tasting/educational event was brought forward by Phil – the bar manager on campus. The event would serve was an educational event, in

which students would learn the difference between the various types of beers, wines, and spirits – while also receiving information in regards to alcohol safety. This event would be a pro-active approach to ensuring that students receive information critical to their safety and health, while also providing a unique experience and event.

Student Centre Audit

Several members of the executive and the full time staff conducted an audit of the Student Centre. The purpose of the audit was to repurpose space that was not being used to its full potential. As well as to find ways the Student Centre can become more environmentally friendly.

Handbook Competition

Five submissions were made to the executive committee; four submissions made it to the competition, posted and advertised on the SCSU Facebook event page. Competition closed on Monday. The winner was determined by number of 'likes'.

Sponsorship Package

The SCSU executives and staff have currently been working to put together a package to increase sponsorships to support our work throughout the year.

Meeting with DSL

The SCSU executives had an introductory meeting with DSL directors to discuss priorities for the year, and how our offices may support each other to better serve students.

Campaigns & Advocacy

Pride 2015

SCSU has been actively involved with Pride initiatives in June, primarily working alongside Scarborough Campus: OUT (SC: OUT), the Sexual and Gender Diversity Office (SGDO), Association of Part Time Undergraduate Students (APUS), and University of Toronto Students' Union (UTSU). Free transportation was provided for UTSC students to attend the annual UofT Pride Pub on Friday, June 19th. Furthermore, SCSU partnered with APUS, UTSU, UTMSU, and Woodsworth Inclusive (WINC) to help organize Love Play

Picnic with Pride on Tuesday, June 23rd, where there was free food, music, games and pride! Student Action Committee

Students from across all three campuses brainstormed ways we can organize through an anti-oppressive framework.

Co-op Meeting
